Thanks to them we've been able to make careers doing work we love and to establish papers that are vital parts of the communities they serve. We've had a great ride. Now we're happily handing the keys to a new generation, Creative Loafing and their CEO Ben Eason. We're confident they will build on what we've established and carry it ably into the future.

Most of the Chicago Reader/Washington City Paper shareholders will continue in a company to be called Quarterfold, Inc., through which we will retain our interests in *The Stranger*, *Portland Mercury*, and *Amsterdam Weekly*.
